

LOUIS LEMIRE

Lou started his minor hockey career in Val Marie, Sask. Like a lot of small town prairie boys he had to move to the city to pursue his hockey career. He moved to Swift Current where his first year he played for the Pee Wee Kinsmen Kings (Provincial Champions), then played for the Bantam Toyotas for the next 2 years (Gold Medal Winner's at the Sask. Winter Games) and then he played his first year of Midget for the Legionnaires. He then went on to Notre Dame where he played Midget for the Hounds (Provincial Champions who went on to the Air Canada Cup – unfortunately he was unable to play due to a broken leg). He then went on to play his Junior hockey with the Prince Albert Raiders (Centennial Cup Champions – now known as the Royal Bank Cup). He then decided to pursue an education at the University of Regina while playing for the U of R Cougars for the next 5 years. Lou graduated with a Bachelor of Education in Physical Education and a minor in French. Upon graduation Lou had a Professional Contract to play the following season in Europe but unfortunately due to circumstances beyond his control that contract fell through so that fall he started being a substitute teacher and played Senior hockey with the Moose Jaw Generals (won Provincials and played in the Allan Cup). That fall he suffered a dislocated shoulder which continued to cause him problems all year and again at the Allan Cup he suffered another dislocation. Surgery wasn't scheduled until the fall so this did not allow Lou a chance to get another Pro contract to play in Europe so he decided to continue with his teaching career and has not looked back.
